



Sweetgums for Western Landscapes

- Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua*):** A large eastern native American tree reaching between 75 to 130 feet when fully grown. Its palm-shaped leaves turn shades of orange, purple, red, and/or yellow. It produces lots of round, prickly fruits in fall.
- Festival Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua* ‘Festival’):** Narrow (20 feet x 60 feet) with bright yellow, orange, and red in the fall color.
- Moraine Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua* ‘Moraine’):** An extra hardy variety (Zones 5-8) with a pyramidal canopy and dark red to burgundy fall color.
- Palo Alto Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua* ‘Palo Alto’):** A well-shaped, pyramidal tree with great fall color.
- Rotundiloba Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua* ‘Rotundiloba’):** A tall tree with little to no fruit, rounded leaves, and highly variable fall color.
